Lt. Gen. DAVID MORRISON, NATASHA STOTT DESPOJA, and CLAIRE HOOPER JOIN GLOBAL CAMPAIGN TO STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS

February 14 2014 to be One Billion Rising's Largest Ever International Day of Action

Today, February 14 at Fed Square, a host of prominent Australians will support thousands of Melbournians in rising up, dancing their protest and saying NO to the violence and exploitation experienced by 1 in 3 women around the world.

One Billion Rising Melbourne is part of the global One Billion Rising movement which uses music, dance and joy to bring the community together and make visible the issues of violence, exploitation and injustice towards women and girls.

In 2013, One Billion Rising Melbourne brought over 2,000 people to dance in front of the Fed Square stage, united with millions of people worldwide to seek justice and empowerment for all women and girls. The campaign was endorsed by former Prime Minister, Julia Gillard; along with a host of prominent politicians, entertainers and activists worldwide.

'Rising for justice' is the theme for 2014 – bringing attention to the poor outcomes experienced by women and girls as they try to navigate complex legal and political systems in their struggle to overcome violence and exploitation.

Once again, the Melbourne contribution to the campaign has attracted great interest and high profile support from Australia's political, military, entertainment and community sectors, including the Hon. Governor General Quentin Bryce, Chief Commissioner of Victoria Police Ken Lay, Lt. Gen. David Morrison AO, Hon Magistrate Kate Hawkins, Natasha Stott Despoja AM, Nicole da Silva, Claire Hooper, Assoc. Prof David Wells and Fustina 'Fuzzy' Agolley.

Messages of support have poured in from these and other role models in the Melbourne community.

"In the world today, violence against women is all too common. I look forward to being part of the One Billion Rising movement on February 14th to rise, release, dance and demand justice - Let's eliminate violence against women all around the world!" said Natasha Stott Despoja AM, Ambassador for Women and Girls, and Chair of the Foundation for the Prevention of violence against women and girls.

Acclaimed Australian comedian Claire Hooper commented, "One billion – that's the one in three women who experience violence or abuse in their lifetime. One billion!! And none of them deserve it."

"The people of Melbourne are ready to see different outcomes for women - in their workplaces, at home and as they walk down the street, "said Dr Cuong La, White Ribbon Ambassador.

Activities commence at Fed Square main stage **from 6.00pm**, where diverse community music and dance troops from across Melbourne will lead the audience in dance protest, including the famous 'Break the Chain' dance routine. Video broadcast will also showcase statements from prominent Australian organisations and individuals who are dedicated to ending violence against women. At 19.00, the event will 'dance' over Princes

Bridge towards the Queen Victoria Gardens where drummers will continue to energize the crowd as we dance our protest together.

One Billion Rising Melbourne is wholly driven by the passion and dedication of volunteers, drawn from Melbourne's women's, family, disability, entertainment and educational sectors.
